We are celebrating another wonderful year in John Leigh Park, which is now 101 years old. This year's Big Lunch was a festival of fun and friendliness, with more people than ever enjoying family picnics in the sunshine in our lovely park. There was music and dance, bowls, football and tennis. There were fun games and crafts for the children, and woodturning displays. 2017 was the park's centenary year, and the Friends of John Leigh Park commissioned two Interpretation Boards, designed by Leslie Turner, to be made by Nature Sign Design of Timperley.





These boards were unveiled in a short ceremony at The Big Lunch. Leslie Turner, who is author of 'Celebrating the history of John Leigh Park 1917-2017', and David Rome of Amey, spoke about the wonderful legacy which Sir John Leigh made to the people of Altrincham toward the end of The First World War: Fourteen acres of hillside with splendid trees provide an ideal setting for relaxation, play and learning. The boards will encourage park visitors to find out more of the history and make best use of the park's pleasures.

The very next day we were assessed for The Green Flag – there wasn't a whisper of litter! Thanks to everyone for being so splendid.
