

The Beauty Of Our Park

The park is a safe place for people to spend time, within the rules, and has been a salvation for our physical and mental health and spiritual wellbeing. During these months, we have grown to value and understand how beautiful our park is. We've appreciated the seasons and the joys which come from the birds (singing louder than ever), squirrels, insects and other creatures within the marvellous context of the hillside, the trees, bushes and other plants. Perhaps most magnificent is the bed at the base of the wall where once there was the derelict toilet block, (photo above). We call this area Dawn's Bank.



There is competition from the Acer Bed, (above). In the ornamental garden there is the Long Border, the mini-orchard and the Holly Bank, as well as the main flower beds. All these areas are tended by the Friends gardening group.



The Friends gardening volunteers have given time and talent to improve the park. During the next few weeks we will be assessed for the Green Flag and by North West in Bloom. The volunteers are working very hard in preparation for these visits.

The perennial plants in the ornamental garden are looking better than ever this year.



In April we laid a magic carpet of preseeded turf in the ornamental garden, (a grant from Trafford Community fund). This has bloomed beautifully and hopefully will continue to do so in future summers.

The boards of the bowling green have been repaired thanks to Trafford MBC. The green looks marvellous, provides sport and fellowship – 'Please Keep off the Grass' signs seem to have been well received and respected. The green is in action almost daily, with special arrangements Mondays at 6.30pm and Saturdays at 2pm.



Whilst bowling, we do have to be aware of constraints of numbers and distancing, though it is generally agreed now that activities outdoors are less hazardous than indoor meetings. The Ladies' Bowling Team are about to start competitive games.



The beautiful trees make the playgrounds special places. The Octagonal Bed is a focus for activities and much enjoyed for its maze-like attributes. We do need to treat it with respect for fear of damaging the plants, hedging and shrubs. We are experimenting with the idea of ground cover to suppress weeds on the Octagonal Bed.

The restrained times of Covid-19 continue as the appearance of new variants and less careful behaviour has led to surges of infection and the continuance of social distancing and rules governing what we should do. The work of our gardening volunteers has been invaluable. Colleagues from Trafford MBC and Amey have played their parts, but have been hit by illness, at least one tragic death, and requirements to self-isolate. They are even more stretched for staff than usual. The Duke of Edinburgh Award students are with us on Saturday mornings and are involved in a range of projects which include edgingoff, attending to the aviary, repairing the verge at Hartley Road Gateway, hedges, weeding, and surveying the 31 benches in preparation for action. Their work is much appreciated - For the most part they say they enjoy being with us!





Regular Monday morning Health Walks started again in April, (10.30am start from the Bowling Pavilion). Health Walks have taken us as far as King George's Pool, the edge of the Devisdale and the Bridgewater canal. There is much to see and appreciate and stories to be told. In and out of the



park we see wild and cultivated plants – from roses to flowers of the field. Then afterwards we enjoy a chat and refreshments outside the bowling pavilion.
