#### **AUTUMN HAPPENINGS**

As we come to the end of 2019, a year of turbulent national and international politics, we look at life as it is on our park. Close to the earth. To summarise what has been happening in the park since the last issue of the newsletter:

After a busy summer of events and enthusiastic use of park facilities, we encountered some difficulties with young people gathering and misusing the bowling green area. The very worst day was September 20<sup>th</sup> when secondary school pupils organised a meeting of hundreds in the park at a time they would otherwise be at school or college. A fight escalated into a riot. Eventually the police were called via 999 and settled matters for a while. Perhaps just a touch of the unrest being felt by young people in response to austerity cuts and fierce exchanges in the media. There is much to be done to address the essential problems.



The following day was the first of the three schools cross country running events, always enjoyable, with hundreds of children taking part, their parents and family cheering them on. Two more of these events followed in October and November. It's great to see so many families enjoying the park.

Proceeds from the sale of snacks and hot drinks go towards the work of the Friends group in the park.

### Looking Ahead .....

We have real belief that **Hartley Road Gateway** will be fixed during the next 12 months. Yet this has taken more than 3 years of negotiation since the early morning demolition by a runaway car.

There are similar delays ahead for simple and predictable **repairs to play equipment**. There seems to be no system in place for such repairs. We are trying to help One Trafford produce a scheme which anticipates maintenance and repair needs, to avoid delays like this for us and for other parks.

A feature of the year has been repeated approaches about establishing a café – mobile or static within the park. It is difficult to see how this can be achieved given the limited facilities, (there is no water supply and no kitchen in the bowling pavilion). Parking near the park is now even more restricted. For now, people are pleased to have ice-creams – and more – in the summer days.

We expect to continue the maintenance and improvement of the park and will organise a similar programme of events to that which has emerged these recent years. First in 2020 will be the Easter Bonnet Parade with Altrincham Church of England School. There will be another Green Flag inspection early in the Spring.

### WALKING FOR HEALTH







Every Monday at 10.30am, the Friends group volunteers lead a health walk, starting from the bowling pavilion.

We are a friendly group who walk around the park and the area around it. The walk is around an hour.

GPs are signposting patients to the benefits of health walks. These walks are popular, and the numbers have grown, as has the walkers' interest in walking further, and getting to know about other health walks in Trafford.

We find areas of interest, and enjoy a cuppa afterwards, either inside or outside the pavilion, dependent on the weather.
