Let's hope it's a good one.



And so – This is Christmas. We have again produced a calendar which celebrates the months as experienced in the park. This has continued to be popular and used by local people for themselves and to share with friends and family who are elsewhere but have affection for this place at this special time.



In addition, we have produced sets of six different cards for Christmas. These show illustrations of some of the stations of the Advent Trail. We hope that they will be well received and used to extend fellowship. Calendars continue to be £7.50 and sets of cards £3.00. It's £10 for a calendar plus a pack of cards. During recent weeks we found that the metal legs supporting our noticeboard at the Oldfield Road entrance had rusted at their base and one had rotted through to produce a hazard of its falling. This resulted in the board and legs being taken away and declared defunct. A replacement would have cost well over £1,000 from the approved and recommended company. Quite marvellously Alan Rydout, George Salkowski and Lynne Dwyer have rescued the noticeboard, repaired and refurbished to a very high standard. It is now secured on the legs of the One Trafford Sign at the Oldfield Road entrance and looks fit for many more years of life.



Among the first additions to the reborn noticeboard is an A3 print of the Tree Trail. This is to encourage people to eniov our spectacular trees and be pleased to identify just some of them. A Tree Trail was produced with the help of Pat Swindley for the Centenary celebrations 2017 and a version has been available on the website since then. It is Kevin Smith's initiative to bring more into the light of day for people walking in the park. We believe it will be welcomed and add to people's enjoyment. The poster now has a QR code which enables you to import the trail to your mobile device and use it to identify the trees and learn about them as you walk around the park.'

They have felt fit to rate the park as 'Outstanding' and recommended the park for the RHS National Award of Distinction. The National Certificates of Distinction are awarded by the RHS across all of the UK. There are different categories.

STORM DAMAGE TO TREES IN THE PARK

High winds on the night of Friday 26th November brought down this massive beech tree. It fell through the boundary wall to Townfield Gardens, requiring action from Trafford MBC/Amey.





There has also been a fairly large fall of branches in the wooded area as you come into the park from Oldfield Road, leaving debris across the path. This damage was due to storm 'Arwen', the first named storm of the 2021/22 season, (Sept 21 – Aug 2022). The next one will be named 'Barra'. Here's hoping we don't get too far through the alphabet with these storm names from the Met office!
